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At the most basic level, you can search for a **specific word** (e.g. **stream, block, smooth, skew, jolt, plush, inveigh, chicanery, addled**). You can also search for words that match a certain pattern, e.g. words starting with **soft*** or **wind***, words ending in ***ism** or ***ship**, words with the root ***back*** or ***heart***, words with the pattern **j-g***, or **hyphenated** words). You can also see a randomly-selected word by clicking on .

This site allows you to see detailed information on the top 60,000 words (lemmas) of English, based on data from the [Corpus of Contemporary American English \(COCA\)](#).

You can see the overall frequency for each word, as well as the frequency of words in different kinds of English -- spoken, fiction, magazines, newspapers, and academic writing. For each word you can also find the 20-30 most frequent collocates (nearby words) and see 200 or more concordance lines (words in context). You can also see a list of synonyms and (from WordNet) words with more specific and more general meanings, and in all of these cases you can click to see the entries for those related words as well.

If this is your first time here, you'll probably want to spend 1-2 minutes looking at the [Guided Tour](#), or just search for a **random word** or **random frequency range** to get started. If you've used COCA before, you might want to look at the [comparison](#) of the two resources. You might also want to consider [downloading the data](#) for offline use.

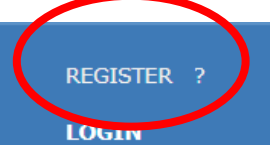
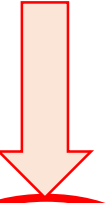

<p>You can click on any word in the collocates list or any highlighted word in the concordance lines to see all entries in the corpus. By default, it shows you that word as a collocate. For example, if you are already looking at the entry for moonlight, then you can click on pale, window, or reflect to see them as collocates. By clicking on QUERY THAT WORD, you can switch to see the full entry for that word; for example reflect.</p>		

After about 20 queries, we ask that you register for continued use of the corpus. This is a one-time process that takes just a minute or two.
