On the contrary or On the other hand

Target Students: Senior Secondary Corpus Used: Corpus Concordance English Class Duration: 120 minutes Module: Learning English through Social Issues Topic: Know about Asperger syndrome Task: Writing a description about their Asperger classmate

Lesson Objectives: By the end of the lesson, the students will be able to (1) Distinguish the meaning difference of "on the contrary" and "on the other hand"; (2) Use "on the contrary" and "on the other hand" in their writing; and (3) Use corpus as a tool for inductive and self-directed learning.

Design Rationale

Secondary students need to write more complex text using a variety of connectives. However, students either easily mix up the two phrases "on the contrary" and "on the other hand" or overuse simple connectives like "but" (Crewe, 1990; Field & Yip, 1992; Granger, 1998). Textbooks also lack explanations about the differences between connectives of similar meaning as below (Brooker, 2010).

Good morning mothers,

Ben, my son, is as lovely and energetic as every child in the park. <u>On the other hand</u>, he is actually an Asperger patient. People always think that taking care of an Asperger child is challenging. I, <u>on the contrary</u>, think it is no big deal though he really needs more attention.

When I complained to a friend that whenever Ben was asked what he wanted for Christmas, he replied 'pets'. My friend said, 'Count yourself lucky'. In this house the campaign for a Glitter Barbie was launched in August. Sometimes, Ben wants to talk to blackberries or go to bed with a pile of socks. I don't really mind even if normal children, ______, would not like this.

The question of education for Asperger children is a difficult one. In a mainstream school such children are easy targets for bullying and teasing. They have little ability to defend themselves other than by uncontrolled outbursts of physical aggression; and they may not be able to explain what is happening to a sympathetic adult.

_____, their IQ is usually average or above. Special schools might be successful in teaching 'life skills' but would perhaps be unable to cater for their intellectual needs. _____, mainstream schools would be able to achieve the later but not the former.

After all, do not be afraid of sending your child to mainstream schools. Just try and see how they adapt.

Part C. Synonym "but" VS "on the contrary" and "on the other hand"

Read the definition of 'But' below:

"But" is used to connect two contrasting ideas.

But is a broaden term which covers meaning of both expressions, 'on the contrary' and 'on the other hand'. However, the two terms cannot replace each other.

Now, to better understand the differences between 'on the contrary' and 'on the other hand', it's your time to try out corpus! Here are the steps:

- 1. Go to https://lextutor.ca/conc/eng/
- 2. Enter 'but' in the keyword blank.
- 3. Choose '2k graded' in the box next to 'In corpus'.
- 4. Click the yellow 'Get Concordance' button.
- 5. Click into concordance 001, 002, 018, 024, 054 and 056.
- 6. Work out if you should replace the 'but' in the sentence with 'on the other hand' or 'on the contrary'.
- 7. Refer to the examples in Part A & B if you are not sure of the meanings of the two phrases.
